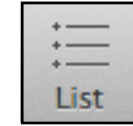


Part 3: Using Collection Figures

List Tips



If you create a lot of lists, customize your toolbar (via right-click) and add a List button. Clicking it brings you directly to the List Gallery, or Option-click to create an instant list with the default style.

Normally if you drag-and-drop figures around within a list or mind map, the figures will keep their set styles and not adopt the style of wherever they're being dropped. This way you aren't surprised by Curio suddenly changing your carefully tweaked figure styles. However, if you press and hold the Shift key right before dropping the figures then they will adopt the style.

To add a new sibling just press Return or Command-Return on your keyboard. A previous sibling can be created using Command-Shift-Return. A child can be created with Command-Option-Return. Use Tab or Shift-Tab to indent or outdent the current item.

Use the List inspector to control whether a title is displayed and what kind of prefixing is used (numbers, bullets, etc). You can even specify custom prefixes at specific hierarchical levels in your list via the inspector.

Use the Share toolbar button to export lists as OPML or MMAP files. Drag-and-drop OPML or MMAP files into Curio to import them into native Curio lists.
